Regulations for Exhibitors

1. All vegetables, fruits and flowers must be grown by the exhibitor on his own

- garden or allotment and pot plants grown by the exhibitor for at least nine weeks. All handicrafts and home produce must have been made by the entrant.
- 2. Entry forms (one for each exhibitor) should be sent to the Show Secretary, together with entrance fees by Thursday 15th August 2024. Additional entry forms may be obtained from the Show Secretary or the Trading Hut. Entries on the day are at the discretion of the Show Committee.
- 3. Exhibits may be staged on the day of the show between 9:00am to 11:00am. Exhibits not in place by 11:00am will be marked "Too late for competition".
- 4. Vases will be provided by the Gardening Club. Plates, dishes, etc. must be provided by the exhibitor. Preserves must be in plain, clean jars with no proprietary names visible.
- 5. A competitor may enter the Novice vegetable, fruit and flower subsections, if he/she has not previously won a first prize in any vegetable or flower class.
- 6. An exhibitor may stage only one exhibit in any class (photography excepted). Exhibits must not have been entered in any previous SSGC show
- 7. The judge's decision will be final. A judge may withhold prizes from exhibits considered unworthy.
- 8. Protests must be made in writing by 3:30pm. on the day. The decision of the Show Committee will be final.
- 9. Exhibits must not be moved before the trophies have been awarded. All exhibits not reclaimed will be disposed of at the committee's discretion.
- 10. The horticultural sections of the show are open to all members cultivating gardens or allotments and not employing labour except for rough digging. The committee reserves the right to have the ground and produce inspected before or after the show.
- 11. Open sections of the show are open to all members of the public.
- 12. Entrance fees for all classes free.
- 13. All trophies are the property of the Society. Winner must make themselves responsible for them and return them in good condition to the Society 14 days prior to the 2025 show.
- 14. Any person winning a trophy for two consecutive years will not be eligible to win it in the third year,
